The Maze and Puzzle of COVID Restrictions

You may wonder why other places might be doing business different than we are. Remember the restrictions imposed are Federal, State, State Agencies, County Health Departments and County regulations. Oh yes and our Grand Lodge Statutes that govern how we do business. We were excited when Pacific County went to Phase 3. The doors reopened, with strict restrictions being followed. Then a week later there was a rollback that changed it all for us. "Indoor service is prohibited, unless food service is provided"

(Quote from Gov. update 7-31-2020)

1. Indoor seating is prohibited unless the establishment provides all of the following: a. Provide a reasonable number of menu items such as: sandwiches, salad, soup, pizza, hamburgers, fry orders, or substantial hors d'oeuvres/appetizers. b. These menu items must be prepared onsite and may not be offered by a contractor. c. Obtain any required food service permit/license from their local jurisdiction

2. For outdoor seating, a temporary structure may be used. Outdoor structures (temporary or permanent) should have no more than two walls to provide appropriate ventilation. The limitation on walls applies to both rigid and flexible walls.

We do not have the manpower or structure to offer a daily "menu" at this time. All are working on some sort of answer before the bad weather hits and we cannot be outside any longer.

People Needed To Help Lounge Stay Open

Another thing we are missing are people to "fill in" when one of our bartenders cannot work for one reason or another. Also, we might be able to have the daily "menu" if we had volunteers to be available to cook and serve if needed.

If you would like to get on the volunteer bar wagon, please go to the internet and do the test to obtain your Washington State Alcohol Server's Card. Then we will be happy to train you to work behind the bar. It's more complicated than pouring beverages.

If you would like to get on the volunteer food wagon, please get your food handler's permit. We will post it with all the others and use you. Shannon Stepp is our Bar Manager and she is the one to speak with about helping out.

The Lodge would like to thank Members Jason Dunsmoor and Craig Murry for relighting our driveway and BBQ area. And a special thanks to John Dunsmoor for keeping us in hot water!
